

SEENO OF OLD MAN BARLOW YMCA CAMP VERSION

The YMCA camp legend of Old Man Barlow- a scary camp story told to the older camp kids by the fire

It was exactly one hundred years ago this year, during the harsh winter, with the lake frozen over very thick. Back then the lake was surrounded by thick forests. None of the cottages you see through the trees were there. On the other side of the lake lived a man by the name of Nathaniel Barlow. Barlow was a mean, nasty sort of man, He didn't have any friends or family, or at least no friends or family who would admit so.

During this winter, one hundred years ago this year, Bowen's Mill offered Nathaniel Barlow a bonus of \$500 if he would get a load of logs to them by 5:00 pm that day. He loaded up his Clydesdale horses after he cut the wood and realized he wouldn't make it on time, so he decided to go across the lake with the load because of his greed.

When the ice cracked, Old Man Barlow and his load and team of horses went through the ice. No one missed him, that is, until springtime one hundred years ago this very year, when

some of the first boy scouts and their fathers were camping on the north side of the lake with their dogs. The dogs were woken and started barking one night and when the fathers went to check them, all they saw was the chains and a seaweed trail to the lake.

The next year the same thing happened, and the boys went missing. One day a wise old Indian said to the sheriff, "Sheriff, I know what happened to those boys. You see when Old Man Barlow fell through the ice he didn't really die. He got captured underneath the ice.

Old Man Barlow could not find the original hole he fell through. But he did find a pocket of air underneath the ice." The greatly worried sheriff asked, "What can we do? What can we do to make sure Old Man Barlow does not hurt anyone ever again?" The old Chippewa Indian responded, "Sheriff, leave it to me."

Now, exactly what the wise Indian did is lost to history. He did not have a Facebook page. The Indian performed some sort of ancient ceremony on the far side of the lake, just about where you might be


able to see the light green trees near a dock, in about four feet of water in Burkholder Bay. You can still see the grave under the water today. About eight feet by four feet piled with rocks. The Indian had explained to the sheriff, "You see sheriff, I can capture the evil spirit of Old Man Barlow in that grave. But there is one catch -- if someone takes a rock, moves a rock, or perhaps even touches a rock, that will release the spirit of Old Man Barlow and he will come after that person and everyone in their cabin." Now it's perfectly safe for you to kayak or canoe over that grave. But if you do, please do not reach down and touch a rock, or move a rock with your paddle, or please, please do not get out of your kayak and take a rock.

And that's the story of Old Man Barlow, one hundred years ago this very year.
